The quilt kit was given to me by a friend who had received it in an estate sale. The colours are new to my palette, but they are delightful Japanese fabrics which I have come to enjoy. There was no colour photo with the kit, and again, deprived of stitching

time, it took three years - mainly at our annual quilting retreats, to complete it. It is larger than I first imagined it to be. Borders included Flying Geese, Squares on Point and Pinwheels. The applique is sewn by hand using two strands of DMC thread. Patterns from Pattern Poole. All of the fabrics for the applique came from my stash, as did the background beige fabric and the backing fabric. 137 x 210 cm.

Cascading Diamonds design. This quilt is the result of a workshop. Assorted colours, pinks and greens, blues, ochre. 265cm x 265cm.

Quilted by the maker

This quilt was all hand sewn using English Paper Piecing method. Original pattern used is French Vintage Mosaic Quilt designed by Brigitte Giblin. Blue, pink, ochre, lavender, yellow, beige. 152 x 156 cm.

Blue Ohio Stars

Quilted by the maker

The piecing of the blocks was commenced in the early 1990's after I saw a photo of a similar quilt in an American magazine. Ohio Star is a traditional pattern. I drafted my block to a size to suit. Some of the fabrics were given to me by friends, and a few of the blocks were stitched by friends. The quilt was completed in 2022. After so many years, there was no matching fabric for the binding, so the quilt has been faced. Traditional. Blue and cream. 237 x 237cm.

I love star quilts. I saw a picture on Pinterest of the star block. The foundation pieced pattern was available as a free download. This quilt a combination of two patterns by Margaret Mew from her book and workshops that I have attended. I have used appliqué techniques and hand piecing throughout the quilt. The design is a medallion centre with an appliquéd basket surrounded by reverse appliquéd four-patch circles. The design is a variation of the original. The layout is a combination of the quilt Rosa Biddlecombe and appliqué in The Wistful Gardener from Margaret's book 'Quilts from La Gare and Other Mewsings'. This is a scrap quilt and the main colour is dusty pink and a mixture of dusty colours of purple, blue, yellow, green and aqua. The fabrics used are reproduction. 215 x 215cm.

Sewcialites Sampler

Quilted by the maker

Using block patterns from Fat Quarter Shop's Sewcialites Quilt-a-long this quilt was constructed using a total of 24 x 9 inch and 9 x 6 inch blocks. Blocks were designed by different designers and with excellent instructions even those rated challenging were fun to complete. After assembling all the blocks quilt was completed with a pieced border using left over fabric. Quilting was done on Brother HV1800Q sewing machine using wavy lines. Traditional block designs, put together in original layout. Block designs available through Fat Quarter Shop, Sewcialites Quilt A Long. (free patterns) Fabric used was from my own stash, mostly colourful floral designs in various colours to create a colourful scrappy look. 140 x 170cm.

This quilt began as a means to 'rescue' some smaller scraps of blue fabrics from a donated stash. To this I added fabrics from the Queanbeyan Quilters (QQ) stash and 'blues' shared by my QQ colleague Pam Cregan. Quilting is 'Circle of Life' pantograph design.
